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On papote en chiffres

- 9 to 12 animations per year
- 119 participants in 2016



What is *On papote*?

- *On papote*, translated literally as "let's chat", is a language studio.
- The participants discuss a topic in a relaxed setting or visit a key location (media centre, theatre etc.) in the city.
- After that, there is always tea and coffee and further opportunities to promote exchange.

What are the goals of *On papote*?

- *On papote* is an informal exchange that, on one hand, promotes the language skills of the participants and, on the other hand, familiarizes the participants with local customs and concerns.
- *On papote* is thus a bridge between cultures.

To which audience is the animation directed?

- *On papote* is aimed at people who want to improve their language skills.
- It is also important to provide the participants with local residents for these exchanges.
- Some people come specifically to expand their knowledge.

How is *On papote* organized?

- In advance: contact with institutions, fix an annual plan;
- Important: Always choose the same day and time;
- Get in contact with language courses or IntegraHons delegates;
- Optional: make the flyer yourself (for each AnimaHon, with a reminder);
- Send SMS or email reminders

How does *On papote* work?

- The participants meet in the library and go together to the place of the animation;
- The animation is presented by one person and supporting material is provided, which, if possible can be taken home;
- Visualization of some words helps with understanding;
- After the animation most people stay for coffee and tea.

Important Note

- *On papote* should always be related to a theme. Depending on the participants, it may be difficult to leave the topic open.
- *On papote* is a studio for language skills or for integration and should not develop into a psychological consultation!
- It can be helpful to limit the animation to a maximum of 10-12 people.

Examples of activities:

- Theatre visit
- Cooking class
- Planting flowers
- Library visit
- Visit to a glassworks
- Making carnival masks or Christmas decorations
- Sewing course
